Summer Fayre

Our annual Summer Fayre will be held on the afternoon of Thursday 19th June. This is always a fantastic event for our community to come together for some food and fun, whilst raising funds for school. Fingers crossed for the weather to be kind!



As families know, permission for leave of absence for holidays will not be granted, in line with the national guidance. We appreciate that families may choose to take a holiday, regardless of a fixed penalty notice (FNP). However, as we have shared previously, the current process is that the council could give a FNP for the first year (£80 per child, per parent), an increased FPN for the second year (£160 per child, per parent), and court prosecution in the third year (resulting in a criminal record). The government have made it clear that pupil attendance is an issue to be tackled and councils/schools should follow policy.

Message from Year 6

This half-term has been a short one, but that doesn't mean that it hasn't been packed with activity. Year 6 have sat their SATs. This involved a week of tests in maths and English. Over the week, they tried incredibly hard and were rewarded with a visit from the ice-cream man and an afternoon of fun in the sun. Nursery – Honeybees and Worms




Year 4 – Art Exhibition
