School Carpark



Parking around schools is always challenging and we understand that, for those who live further afield, this can be problematic at the beginning and end of the school day. However, like the vast majority of schools, we cannot accommodate parents/carers who want to use the school carpark when dropping off or collecting their children.

Very early in the morning and late in the afternoon, parents accessing the breakfast and afterschool club do access the carpark when the barrier is open. Additionally, *children* with disabilities and who are Blue Badge holders are given permission to access the appropriate spaces. Occasionally, where there has been a short term medical need, permission has been granted. It is important to note that St. Anne's Church allows their car park to be used for parents/carers which is a very short walk from the school.

As you will be aware, school parking is limited and it is required for staff and visitors. We thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Walking Bus



To support transporting children to school, our 'Walking Bus' is available every day. Two members of staff meet at Allerdene shops at 8:30am and walk the children safely over the bridge and straight into the school building. This is a great way of reducing congestion around the school building and enables the children to start the day with a healthy walk. Nursery - 'Bearmania'



The Nursery children have enjoyed looking at a non-fiction text about different types of bears. They were particularly interested in polar bears and enjoyed playing with the arctic scene in the water tray. The children were fascinated to learn how ice was made and liked exploring some giant ice blocks. They also enjoyed sharing the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and then retelling the story in the role play area and book area. Everyone tasted delicious porridge at snack time that Mrs Anderson had made just right! The children and staff also read 'This is the Bear and the Picnic Lunch' and then made their own pretend and real picnics. Everyone enjoyed the sandwiches that were made at the picnic area on the field and the boys and girls talked about their own experiences of going on picnics. After reading 'Biscuit Bear', the children made their own biscuits that they decorated with yellow icing like Pudsey Bear.

Reception - Outdoor Games




In Reception, the children invented their own game to play in the outdoor area, involving plastic skittles and water. The children worked as a team to fill up the plastic bottles with water. After this, they chose to practise their throwing skills by seeing who could knock the water skittles over.

Year 1 - Space Rocket Fun!



The children have enjoyed their Design & Technology lessons this half term. They have been investigating how pictures move and have read books with moving parts. Using their new knowledge, they made a zooming rocket using a slider and then all zoomed off to space!

Year 2 - Science Food Chains



In Science, Year 2 have been learning about food chains. The children have been using some scientific vocabulary such as: predator, prey, producer, consumer, herbivore, carnivore and omnivore. Everyone was keen to make their own food chain. They did this by linking their parts in a paper chain style. They were very proud of their final products.

Year 3 - Creating Games in PE



In Year 3, the boys and girls have been working creatively in a group to plan their own challenging game. The children were given a choice of equipment and they had to decide on rules and strategies to make their games fair, safe and fun. The boys and girls then described their games to the rest of the class and explained why particular rules had been made. Once this was done the they had the chance to play each other's games which was great fun!

Year 4 - Playing the Glockenspiel



Year 4 children have enjoyed learning to play the glockenspiel in their music lessons. They have been reading musical notation and have learned to play some simple tunes with an accompaniment. The children have also had the chance to make their own music by improvising with the notes C, E and F.

Year 5 - Anglo Saxon Workshop



Year 5 had an amazing time with a special visitor; Dr Jo is an Anglo Saxon specialist who came in to launch their History topic. The children learned all about day-to-day life for a typical Anglo Saxon, although they didn't fancy the idea of working on a farm at 9 and 10 years old! The children also took part in a mock burial and discovered that the Anglo-Saxons thought that burying someone with their precious belongings meant they would have them with them in the afterlife. The children enjoyed: playing some fabulous games from the Anglo Saxon era, writing their names using a feather (using the Anglo Saxon alphabet of course!), braiding with wool, wove twigs and even playing Nine Men's Morris!

Year 6 - A Special Visitor



As part of their 'Peacekeepers' topic, Year 6 have been learning about Judaism. Mr Glickman, a local Jewish Rabbi, was invited into school to speak to the children about the religion and some of the main festivals including Rosh Hashanah. It was a really interesting and engaging discussion, in which the children were able to ask a lot of questions to discover information from an expert.
